1. Purpose

This policy sets forth the proper use, accounting, and reporting of program ifrcome Sponsored Pojects.

- 2. Definitions
  - a. Program Income the grossincome earned by the University that is directly generated by a supported activity or earned as a result of consored Poject during the period of its performance.
  - b. Sponsored Project: an activity funded by a **bbniv**ersity entity requiring the University, by written agreement, to conduct certain work under a set plan, a set schedule, and a set budget, typically for the purpose of supporting research, instruction or public service through tangible or intangible deliverables that are the ultimate result of the Project
  - c. Principal Investigator/Project Director: ("PI"/"PD") the primary individual who is responsible and accountable for activities on a Sponsored Project.
- 3. Policy
  - a. The University is reqired to identify, document, and report gram hcomegenerated on Sponsored Pojectsin accordance with federal administrative requirements, awarding agency regulations, and the terms and conditions of the a Watedfederal government encourages recipients of its fundingearn income to defray our costs where appropriate. However, University may not earn or keep any profit resulting from federal financial assistance, unless explicitly authorized by erms and conditions of the federal awardAdditionally, University Service/Recharge Centers may not provide services for a profit and must charge all users, including those associated with Sponsored Projects, a Billing Rate that merely allows the Certters coup costs, as provided in University Policy 5:8.
  - b. ProgramIncomemay include but is not limited to:

- i. Fees earned from services performed under an award, such as laboratory tests;
- ii. Rental or usage fees, such as those earned from fees charged for use of computer or laboratory equipment purchased with sponsored project,funds
- iii. Proceeds from the sale of commodities, items, or research materials (such as animal models) fabricated with sponsored project funds
- iv. Proceeds from the sale of software, tapes, ublications created witsponsored project funds
- v. Fees from participants attending conferensesposia or otherActivities sponsored by an awarand
- vi. Principal and interest loans made with federal award funds.
- c. Unless otherwise specified in t**bp**onsor's terms and conditions of the award, program income does not include:
  - i. Interest earned on advances of federal funds;
  - ii. Credits, rebates, discounts;
  - iii. Levies, fines and other such revenues raised by the University in its governmental capacity;
  - iv. Proceeds from the sale of real property, equipment, or supplies; and
  - v. Royalties from patents and copyrights (unless addressed in the award terms, or royalties or license fees for unpatented, but potentially patentable discoveries that
