





The 12 credits of elective courses in the minor will now require a WMST cross-list, rather than taking courses from a static list. In the efforts to create a vibrant, interdisciplinary minor that will encourage students to take courses across the university, students will take any WMST cross-listed courses across three different prefixes (SOC, ENGL, SPCM, HDFS, etc.). As written in the WGSS a curriculum subcommittee comprised by members of the WGSS Advisory Committee, including the instructor of WMST 247, will determine the WMST cross-listed courses. The subcommittee will review syllabi and invite instructors to explain their pedagogy in their goal to obtain the WMST cross-listing. The curriculum subcommittee will approve the WMST cross-listing for courses that meet any of the goals of the three student learning outcomes for the minor: 1) Recognize gender and sexuality as socio-cultural constructs that intersect with race, ethnicity, ability, nationality, and socio-economic status, among other aspects of identity; 2) Analyze how institutions and policies influence and reinforce power inequities and cultural expectations about gender and sexuality; and 3) Engage in critical inquiry using theoretical and methodological lenses grounded in gender and sexuality studies. Importantly, the content and pedagogy of any WMST cross-listed course must include a majority of focus on women, gender, and/or sexuality studies.
