LA 132 will cover unique aspects of landscape representation and exploration, versus the focus on buildings in ARCH 151 or the focus on art and general design in DSGN 152. The proposed course highlights specific tools and methods used by the landscape architecture profession and is the representational foundation upon which future coursework is based. This course will fill gaps in dgi kppkpi 'uwf gpuø'wpf gtucpf kpi 'of the landscape and their ability to use the basic tools and methods of the profession. The course provides students with a foundation of how to perceive and describe the landscape in a variety of ways, thus facilitating and accelerating their success in subsequent coursework in the discipline.
