these three institutions, and over the past two years there has been ongoing discussion about shifting the collaborative to allow for online delivery. Institutional representatives met to develop a new framework for maintaining the collaborative into the next decade. In November 2018 the Academic Affairs Guidelines 2.19 Collaborative German Program Administration Guidelines¹ were established outlining the collaborative purpose, partners and institutional leads, common assessment structure, curriculum, textbook and instructional resources, and funding model. Going forward (Fall 2020) this new curriculum will go into place only between the cooperative partners, SDSU and USD, since NSU withdrew from the program in 2019. This program modification aligns the German program requirements for SDSU and USD to match the curriculum listed in Appendix A of the collaborative guidelines.
