1. Provide specific reasons for the proposal of this course and explain how the changes enhance the curriculum.
ARCH 230-230L Construction Materials \& Lab (3 cr.) will serve as a common course for Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Interior Design majors creating efficiencies in curricular delivery and cross disciplinary experiences for the students rather than separate courses teaching similar material and address content required for accreditation. The proposed course will replace ID 314 Building Systems and Construction ( 3 cr .) and CM 216-216L Construction Methods and Materials and Lab (4 cr.) for these programs. LA 314 will no longer be offered at SDSU. CM 216216L does not currently deliver the content required for accreditation. The course focus differs from CM 216-216L on material properties specified in construction documents to a focus on decision making in creation of construction documents. The new course addresses the accreditation knowledge area needs of economic, logistic, social justice, and aesthetic factors of material selections and assembly methods that inform interdisciplinary decision making for licensed professionals in Architecture and Landscape Architecture and certified professionals in Interior Design.
