SUBJECT: Community Notification of Potential, Imminent or Active Threat to the University NUMBER: 10:3

1. Purpose

This policy and its procedures set forth the guidelines for when and how the University provides information to the University community regarding potential, imminent and active threats to the University in compliance with the Clery Act and other applied by and policies.

- 2. Definitions
 - a. Timely Warnings: Notifications the University community that provide information on Clery Act crimes that occur on University Clery geography, are reported to campus security authorities, the University Police Department ("UPD"), or local law enforcement and pose a serious or continuing threattorients and employees.
 - c. Other Notifications: In addition to imely Warnings and Energency Notification, sthe University, at its discretion, mapprovide information to the University community when an incident does not meet the threshold formaeTy Warning or an Energency Notification.
- 3. Policy
 - a. The University establishes campus safety and security measures to be observed by and for the benefit of all students, employees, and visitions visitions, Emergency Notifications, and Other Notifications are designed to inform and direct community members to mitigate the damage of a real or potential threat to the University. accomplish this, the Noversity uses redundant means communication to provide Timely Warnings, Emergency Notifications, and Other Notifications, and Other Notifications, and Other Notifications, communication to provide Timely Warnings, Emergency Notifications, and Other Notifications the University community.

In criminal cases information will be provided to the xtent possible without compromising law enforcement efforts.

The Chair of the Emergency Management Team, or designee, in consultation with the appropriate member(s) of the Emergency Management, Tarathother University units as appropriate, is responsible for initiating Timely Warnings, Emergency Notifications, and Other Notifications to the campus community.
- e. The University'sEmergency Management Team (EMT), under the directions Ofhair, is responsible for the preparation for, responsentd recovery from real potential emergencies that affect, may affect, the University community.
